

Chairperson Neal Stenberg called the special meeting, budget hearing, of the Southeast Community College Board of Governors to order at 3:02 p.m. on Tuesday, September 26, 2023, at the Milford Campus, 600 State Street, Milford, Nebraska.

Chairperson Stenberg welcomed everyone to the meeting. He indicated that it was necessary for any member of the public wishing to testify to sign in and that individuals would be allowed a maximum of five minutes to speak.

PUBLIC MEETING LAW COMPLIANCE STATEMENT

Chairperson Stenberg stated the public meeting notice had been published in the Lincoln Journal Star on Sunday, September 17, 2023, as well as posted on the bulletin board in the Area Office and on the website. He stated that the meeting is conducted according to the principles of the revised *Robert's Rules of Order*.

Chairperson Stenberg indicated that supplementary materials were available for the public, along with a copy of the Open Meetings Law.

2023-2024 BUDGET HEARING

Chairperson Stenberg convened the 2023-2024 public budget hearing at 3:07 p.m. Dr. Illich and Amy Jorgens, Vice President of Administrative Services, presented the 2023-2024 Budget.

Ms. Jorgens reviewed the Budget Hearing and Budget Summary 2023-2024 at a total tax levy at 10.50 cents per \$100 valuation (8.5 cents general fund and 2.0 cents capital improvement fund). This information was also available for public review prior to the Board meeting via SCC's Board Meeting software platform ("Onboard"), SCC's home office, published in the Lincoln Journal Star and at least 3 copies were available to the public at the meeting. Several informational items were presented and available for review including a SCC General Fund Historical Summary, State Aid Summary for all Nebraska community colleges, Agency No 83 Appropriation, Valuation and Levy Summary for all Nebraska community colleges, Certification of Taxable Value for Tax Year 2023 with Growth for the SCC 15 county area, SCC Allowable Growth Calculation, Enrollment and Tuition Summary for all Nebraska community colleges, Tuition and Fee Summary per credit hour for all Nebraska community colleges, the SCC Expanded Expenditure List, the 2023-2024 General Fund Budget Revenue and Expense Summary, the General Fund Budget Expenditures by PCS, SCC Non-Recurring Expenditures Projects, SCC Potential Capital Improvement Projects, Capital Improvement Fund and Levy with Balances through June 30, 2024 (2.0 cents CIF levy) and the Total SCC Budget per Notice of Budget Hearing and Budget Summary 2023-2024 of \$351,562,262 compared to 2022-2023 budget of \$348,168,302 or a .97% increase.

The 2023-2024 General Fund Budget Revenue and Expense Summary was explained in detail. The total 2023-2024 general fund budget at 8.5 cents per \$100 valuation was \$114,300,722 or a 16.87% increase from the 2022-2023 general fund budget. General fund budget revenues for 2023-2024 included, but was not limited to state aid (including dual enrollment) of \$30,296,422 or a 1.4% increase; a property valuation increase of 14.77% over the 15-county area for a total valuation of \$79,122,403,321 resulting in general fund taxes at 8.5 cents per \$100 valuation of \$67,254,043 or a 32.4% increase; and tuition of \$16,252,964 or a .54% decrease.

Expenditures included, but was not limited to salary and benefits of \$83,542,985 or a 5.67% increase; operating \$18,624,695 or a 10.6% increase; equipment of \$1,500,000 or a 50% increase; expanded expenditures of \$1,500,000 and nonrecurring expenditure projects of \$8,620,207 which was a new line item on the general fund summary. The summary resulted in a balanced 2023-2024 general fund budget, whereas revenues of \$114,300,722 equal expenses of \$114,300,722.

Ms. Jorgens also reviewed in detail the total SCC budget per Notice of Budget Hearing & Budget Summary 2023-2024 of \$351,562,262 that included several funds including Restricted (Self-Supporting) \$93,075,000, Other Facilities Project Financing \$107,000,000, Capital Improvement Fund \$37,186,540, and General Fund budget \$114,300,722. Also reviewed by Ms. Jorgens was the Uniform Budget Document and required supporting documentation and Interlocal Agreement Report to be filed with the Auditor of Public Accounts by September 30, 2023.

Ms. Jorgens then reviewed the Budget Hearing and Budget Summary 2023-2024 at a total tax levy at 9.37 cents per \$100 valuation (7.37 cents general fund and 2.0 cents capital improvement fund). This information was handed out to all board members via paper and at least 3 copies were available to the public. The same information that was previously

presented at the 10.5 cent total levy was updated with the 9.37 cent total levy and presented including a SCC General Fund Historical Summary, State Aid Summary for all Nebraska community colleges, Agency No 83 Appropriation, Valuation and Levy Summary for all Nebraska community colleges, Certification of Taxable Value for Tax Year 2023 with Growth for the SCC 15 county area, SCC Allowable Growth Calculation, Enrollment and Tuition Summary for all Nebraska community colleges, Tuition and Fee Summary per credit hour for all Nebraska community colleges, the SCC Expanded Expenditure List, the 2023-2024 General Fund Budget Revenue and Expense Summary, the General Fund Budget Expenditures by PCS, SCC Non-Recurring Expenditures Projects, SCC Potential Capital Improvement Projects, Capital Improvement Fund and Levy with Balances through June 30, 2024 (2.0 cents CIF levy) and the Total SCC Budget per Notice of Budget Hearing and Budget Summary 2023-2024 of \$342,621,430 compared to 2022-2023 budget of \$348,168,302 or a decrease of 1.59%.

The 2023-2024 General Fund Budget Revenue and Expense Summary was explained in detail. The 7.37 cent general fund levy resulted in a total general fund budget 2023-2024 of \$105,359,890 or a 7.72% increase from the 2022-2023 general fund budget. General fund budget revenues for 2023-2024 included but was not limited to state aid (including dual enrollment) of \$30,296,422 or a 1.4% increase; a property valuation increase of 14.77% over the 15-county area for a total valuation of \$79,122,403,321 resulting in general fund taxes at 7.37 cents per \$100 valuation of \$58,313,211 or a 14.77% increase; and tuition of \$16,252,964 or a .54% decrease.

Expenditures included, but was not limited to salary and benefits of \$83,542,985 or a 5.67% increase; operating \$18,624,695 or a 10.6% increase; equipment of \$1,500,000 or a 50% increase; and expanded expenditures of \$1,179,375. Ms. Jorgens informed the Board that the 7.37 cent general fund levy resulted in the nonrecurring expenditure projects to be eliminated or \$0. The summary resulted in a balanced 2023-2024 general fund budget, whereas revenues \$105,359,890 equal expenses \$105,359,890.

Ms. Jorgens also reviewed in detail the total SCC budget per Notice of Budget Hearing & Budget Summary 2023-2024 of \$342,621,430 included several funds including Restricted (Self-Supporting) \$93,075,000, Other Facilities Project Financing \$107,000,000, Capital Improvement Fund \$37,186,540, and General Fund budget \$105,359,890. Also reviewed was the Uniform Budget Document and required supporting documentation and Interlocal Agreement Report to be filed with the Auditor of Public Accounts by September 30, 2023.

Dr. McCormick asked if the non-recurring expenditures projects were the same in both budget scenarios? Ms. Jorgens and Dr. Illich stated that projects will need to be prioritized for the lower budget.

Mr. Byers asked what happens if the board goes with the revised budget when it wasn't publicized? Mr. Aldridge, Legal Counsel, mentioned that the board can adopt a new budget from what was published.

Chairperson Stenberg closed the budget hearing at 3:34 p.m.

BUDGET RESOLUTION 2023-2024

Discuss, consider and take all necessary action in regard to the proposed budget for Southeast Community College Area for the 2023-2024 fiscal year, pursuant to the provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat. §§13-501 to 13-513.

Chairperson Stenberg asked for discussion.

Mr. Byers mentioned that it will hurt SCC more if they don't leave the budget as is.

Mr. Uhrmacher mentioned going to the hearing at the Capital testifying against LB 783 and mentioned being in support of LB 243. He mentioned that a speaker mentioned attending meetings and hearing people being in favor of the increase and stated that there are constituents in support of the increase. Mr. Uhrmacher stated that another speaker mentioned trust and he stated that trust goes both ways. He mentioned no matter what decision the board makes there will be consequences.

Ms. Seim mentioned that the board didn't increase out of respect for their constituents and a decision needs to be made.

Dr. Sherwood mentioned that he doesn't like the two choices that are mentioned and feels the board needed to go to the max.

Chairperson Stenberg mentioned that if they set their levy at 7.37 cents that it will affect the constituents that they have protected. He mentioned that closing learning centers, post-secondary education becoming unaffordable, and not being able to meet the needs of the area will be affected. He stated that he is not only talking about Lincoln but the entire Southeast Community College area. He stated that SCC has followed the rules given by the Legislature and stated that the rules were changed after they set a preliminary budget. He

mentioned that the Legislature didn't want SCC to go above their 2022-2023 budget and mentioned that action will be taken if SCC takes the higher budget.

Dr. McCormick mentioned that we had a good understanding with the Legislature and got the 100% tax refund to the tax payers. She mentioned that there have been claims that SCC was not following the rules and she doesn't agree. She mentioned that the non-recurring expense in the 7.37 cent levy will not happen and those are all important and needed projects.

Mr. Gunther mentioned that this process has been a mess. He mentioned that going with the 8.50 is alarming with what the Government will do and what consequences they will face.

Ms. Boellstorff mentioned that the board has been responsible for as long as she has been a board member. She mentioned that the legislature wanted them to reconsider and the board had done that by lowering the levy to 8.50 cents.

Ms. Hartman mentioned that SCC not spending the money like they should have is now biting them. She mentioned that SCC has facilities that they are proud of and feel they are being punished for keeping the levy so low for so long.

Dr. Yates mentioned they have been all over the 15 counties service area and mentioned that SCC had been very conservative for their students.

Mr. Uhrmacher mentioned that he agrees with the statement Ms. Boellstorff made. He mentioned that in the letter they received from State Senators it mentioned that at the end it threatens if SCC does increase and the legislature will take action. He feels that if the board goes with the 8.50 cents that the consequences will be greater than if they lower the levy to 7.37.

Dr. McCormick mentioned that the legislature didn't go against the LB 783.

Mr. Byers mentioned that the Governor rushed LB 243 without any thought or concern for Community Colleges. He mentioned that he is in favor with the 8.50 levy increase. He mentioned the consequences can be greater than going with the lower levy.

Ms. Herrington mentioned that she feels being threatened was not the way to go and had put a false narrative in the 15 counties service area. She wanted everyone in attendance to know that the board doesn't take this lightly.

Dr. Illich mentioned that as President of SCC he thanked the board for the work they have put into the budget. He mentioned that he had spoken to Senators the past few weeks discussing the budget.
