Driver Education Instructor Training

Prerequisites: Must be at least 21 years of age, have a high school diploma or equivalent, valid operator's license held in the state of residence for two consecutive years and clean driving record (for the prior five years, the instructor candidate must have no violation on record for which five or more points might be assessed, including probation or other situations in which no points were actually assessed for the violation. The instructor candidate must have no suspensions or revocations on record within the last five years, including no convictions for DWI or any alcohol- or drug-related offense in connection with motor vehicle use. DMV Title 247.)

This is a Department of Motor Vehicles-approved course for the certification of instructors to teach driver education in a non-credit format. 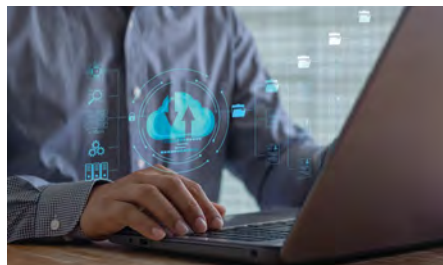

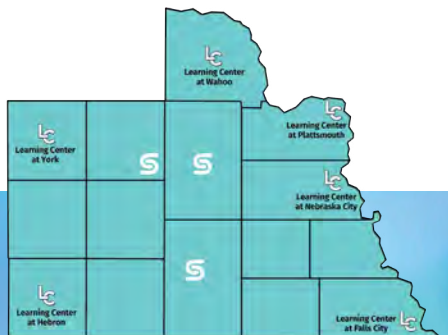
