#### The Role of the Interpreter & Translator

Prerequisite: Completion of secondary education (high school) AND an average score of 106 or above on the four-part ESL Accuplacer Test taken within the last three years. Attend orientation on September 18.

This practice-oriented course will immediately immerse you in focused discussions, lectures and problem-solving activities that highlight the everyday issues faced in interpreting. The goal of the course is to educate you about ethical behavior: what it means to be a "professional" and how these key proficiencies play an integral role in being a skilled and competent interpreter.

You must have an email account to register online.

- Search for your class by entering either a key word in the title or the course number. Click Submit. (Enter information in only one field for broader results.)

- 5. Optional: Enter your Additional Registration Information and click Submit.
